It has been an enriching process. I have used the WEIS adapted to the educational setting in order to evaluate courses given, and receive the feedback and suggestions from students. I have used the OPHI-II when some students need support and orientation, sometimes to help them to make decisions if they really want to continue or not their studies in OT. I have used the VQ continuously, the ACIS. Always sharing with them. I use the OSA at the beginning of group projects so they get to decide to participate in roles they feel they have the skills for.

It has been great experience. When I teach MOHO courses I ask them to evaluate me with AMPS, ACIS, and VQ..it is great what you get to learn...
